1 AWARENESS

3 REPORT

4 SCAFFOLD

We recommend sharing our [Know Your Rights Toolkit for Scholarship and Educational Support Providers](#) with your teams and volunteers.

It's critical that students have trusted adults that they can turn to when they experience a financial aid challenge. They may not know if the problem they're facing is scholarship displacement. The more your staff can recognize and talk about the issue, the better they can serve students in identifying scholarship displacement and advocating for and on behalf of students.



5 TRAIN

NCCPC offers a [Train-the-Trainer](#) service for members. This includes a Facilitation Guide, Video, and other resources so that your staff can confidently lead presentations about scholarship displacement with your teams, volunteers, students, and families.
