




Steps to Membership

1	Confirm interest in membership with NCCPC.	Learn more about our Members at norcalpromisecoalition.org/membership/.

3	Sign the MOU by June 30.	The MOU will be sent to you to sign electronically using DropboxSign. NCCPC's fiscal year is July 1 to June 30. When you join, you are a member for the remainder of the fiscal year. Members renew annually.	
4	Engage one or more staff in one or more committees and/or campaigns.	View the Committee and Events schedule at norcalpromisecoalition.org/events/. Email admin@norcalpromisecoalition.org to observe or join a committee.

What is an NCCPC Committee?

NCCPC Committees are composed of NCCPC members organized around the coalition's three pillars: Policy, Partnerships, and Communities of Practice. NCCPC also facilitates temporary, short-term ad hoc committees to address topics like fundraising, data, financial literacy, and evaluation. Each committee is led by 1-2 Co-Chairs.

How do I join and how many can I join?

NCCPC members can join as many committees as they want, but we recommend no more than two in a given fiscal year to preserve member bandwidth. Committees meet for an hour at least 11 times per year, monthly, on the same day each month unless otherwise stated. Your time commitment is dependent on how many meetings you attend and which projects/campaigns you actively participate in. COMMITTEES FOCUSED ON 4 PILLARS

POLICY: Advocacy coordination to focus on systems change efforts that promote college access, affordability, persistence, and success. **CAMPUS PARTNERSHIPS:** Partnering with colleges to enter secure student-level data-sharing agreements for a coordinated care approach that includes on- and off-campus resources and financial support.

<u>WORKFORCE PARTNERSHIPS:</u> Employer partnerships to develop students' career clarity and provide targeted internship and job placement. <u>COMMUNITIES OF PRACTICE</u>: A peer-learning space for the co-creation of best and first practices, and development, implementation, and continuous improvement of solutions.
